HAMILTON COUNTY STAMP OUT HUNGER FOOD DRIVE- RESULTS

The Delaware Township Food Pantry participated in the annual National Association of Letter Carrier's 'Stamp Out Hunger' food drive on Saturday, May 13th, 2023. Food was collected by postal workers and distributed to food pantries by volunteers and food pantry staff. Food equivalent to 43,700 meals was donated and distributed to 17 local food pantries!



The Delaware Township Food Pantry received 5,180 pounds of food that the Trustee's Office use to provide families with food throughout the summer.

Thank you to everyone who donated, the Fishers & Noblesville Post Offices for all their hard work collecting donations, Harvest Food Bank for coordinating the event, and all the volunteers who helped unload the food. This food drive would not have been possible without all of you!

HAMILTON COUNTY INVASIVES PARTNERSHIP

What is HIP?

The Hamilton County Invasives Partnership (HIP) was established in 2019 and their mission is to mobilize land stewards to manage and eliminate invasive species in Hamilton County. HIP is made up of concerned citizens, property managers owners and and representatives from groups such as: municipalities, parks and recreation departments, environmental organizations, community groups, non-profits, businesses, and more.

HIP has a strike team that works to combat invasive species in a hands on way. They provide support and labor to remove invasive species at partner sites. They also have resources on their website on alternatives to invasive plants that you may have on your property.

Why should we take action against invasive species?



Invasive English Ivy

Invasive species are a problem for many reasons. To name a few, they take resources (sunlight, soil, space, etc.) from native plants and reduce the types of plants in an ecosystem. A lot of invasive species are resilient and can reproduce easily. This can cause an overabundance of invasive species and a lack of diversity of other plants. Wildlife and insects habitats are effected and pollinators are displaced by these degrading ecosystems. Endangered native species face extinction if invasive species are not controlled. Additionally, invasive species directly negatively affect humans by increasing the tick and mosquito population.

to What can you do to help combat invasive plants?

You can request an invasive species assessment from HIP to find out if you have any invasive species on your property and come up with a plan to remove them. *Did you know that 83% of invasive species that are found in natural green spaces actually originate from people's own gardens?*

Even if you do it gradually over time, removing invasive species from your yard is a key way to help! You can replace invasive species with native plants. To find native species consult the National Wildlife Federation's native plant finder and the lndiana.native plant Society's website.
